Dear Brother Guerrero:

Thank you for your letter of March 18, 2007, advising of the resolution on comprehensive immigration reform which was recently adopted at the 17th Annual Conference of the Latino Caucus.

There is no doubt that this office recognizes the significance of the immigration reform issue to all ATU members, as well as the Labor Movement more generally. We therefore greatly appreciate the attention which has been afforded to this matter by the Latino Caucus.

I am pleased to confirm that it is in fact our intention to put an ATU-sponsored resolution on immigration reform before the delegates to our 55th Convention with the full backing of the International's executive officers and the General Executive Board. The membership of Local 694 (San Antonio, TX), further, has separately adopted the resolution enacted by the Caucus (which, in turn, duplicated that passed by the Labor Council for Latin American Advancement in March 2006) and has submitted such for consideration by the Las Vegas delegates in accordance with the procedures established in Section 6.16 of our Constitution and General Laws. There is no doubt, then, that the question will be afforded the attention it properly deserves.

Please know that the many contributions of the Latino Caucus to our ATU family, as well as your own efforts on behalf of the Caucus itself, are certainly and greatly appreciated.
